Personal Statement/ Biography:

Abigail graduated from University College Dublin (UCD) in 2003 with a BSc (Hons) in Cell Biology and Molecular Genetics. She entered the medical scientist profession through the Post Graduate Trainee Grade specialising in Gynae Cytology and worked as a medical scientist in Cytology in St. Luke's Hospital Rathgar. Here, she completed her MSc in Molecular Pathology (DIT/TCD). In 2008, upon closure of cytology labs, she was redeployed to the microbiology lab in St. Vincent's University Hospital where she developed a wide interest in microbiology specialities including molecular microbiology and antimicrobial susceptibility testing. She was promoted to Senior Medical Scientist in 2010 and became Quality Facilitator for the department, developing her interest in quality and patient safety. Abigail completed her MSc in Healthcare Management (Royal College of Surgeons, Ireland) in 2015 and became Chief Medical Scientist in microbiology in 2018. She is a fellow of the Academy of Clinical Science and Laboratory Medicine (ACSLM) and also holds a Prince 2 qualification in Project Management.

Abigail has a wealth of experience in change management due to the amalgamation of several microbiology labs from surrounding hospitals to SVUH, along with the many changes in testing practices in microbiology over the past 14 years. Recent achievements include leading the implementation of a molecular microbiology lab within the department during the Covid pandemic and she is presently navigating the department's transition to ordercomms from paper based requests. She is also focused on encouraging a healthy work-life balance amongst the medical scientists in her department in order to prevent burn-out due the strain of the staff shortages in the laboratory.
